THE ROOFTOP VISION

The Vision of The Rooftop

Since becoming a Christian from a 'never-churched' background, Rev Dennis Pethers, the Founder of The Rooftop has longed to see a global awakening that will result in the church becoming what Jesus always intended. The church that Jesus is building is not a place or an institution, but a movement of disciples, all over the world. It is a global community of followers who are united behind Jesus and His Mission 'to seek and to save what was lost' (Luke 19:10) by making disciples who make disciples among all the people of the world.

Tragically, so many churches seem to have forgotten the urgency of the mission of Jesus, and the passion of God for those who are beyond the walls. They have become focused primarily on what happens inside the walls!

The Rooftop is a ministry that is preparing for, and longing to see the church experience a global awakening that will result in a movement of disciples making disciples among those that are beyond the walls of the church as Christians across the world Join Jesus in His Mission.

Why 'The Rooftop?'

The Rooftop ministry takes its name from the account of Peter on the rooftop in Acts chapter 10.

In the first nine chapters of Acts, the gospel had been shared almost exclusively with people from a 'Jewish faith background'. These people were familiar with Jewish traditions, believed in the scriptures and had been brought up with an understanding of God.

God's passion is for the whole world and all people. He wanted Peter to take the gospel outside the walls, to the Gentiles, those who were not familiar with the traditions and who did not have a clear understanding of God.

FOR PETER TO BE WILLING TO DO THIS HE NEEDED TO CHANGE!

When Peter had an encounter with God on the rooftop, he began, for the first time, to see things from God's perspective and be willing to do what was in line with God's will rather than what he had been familiar with for all of his life.

He had to understand that God's passion is for those who were 'outside' of the walls, this was a totally new perspective.

A NEW PERSPECTIVE

The biblical account of Peter on The Rooftop has contains three very important aspects:

- 1. Peter's rooftop 'Encounter'. As Peter was praying on the rooftop he had an encounter with God that revolutionized his understanding of evangelism and disciple-making.
- 2. Peter went to the house of Cornelius to 'Engage' with people beyond the walls. Having encountered God and realized that he 'should not call unclean anything that God has called clean', Peter went to the house of a Gentile and preached the gospel. He broke out of the constraints of what he had inherited and preached the gospel 'outside' of the walls of Judaism—he 'engaged' with the lost.
- 3. As a result, the Kingdom could '**Expand**'. The gospel was set free from the constraints of Judaism and was now able to spread across the whole world—the good news of Jesus is for those BEYOND THE WALLS.

Peter's experience on the rooftop was a pivotal moment for the church. Had he not been on the rooftop (praying) where he received a fresh vision from God, he may never have evangelized and made disciples among the Gentiles.

He needed a fresh vision of God's passion for the lost to take him beyond what he had always known and to face the new reality. Here was his new reality: *He saw that God loves people who do not conform to all of the customs that he had always been familiar with!*

For Peter, the rooftop experience was a pivotal crossroads. The church today is at a similar crossroads. Previous generations have been raised within church contexts and have understood and were familiar with our customs. Now, across generations there are increasing numbers of people who never attend church and know little or nothing about Jesus.

To reach these people that Jesus came to seek and to save, it is vital that we each Join Jesus in His Mission.




THE ROOFTOP THREE-STEP PROCESS

Based on the experience of Peter in Acts 10 and 11, 'The Rooftop' is a three-step process that will enable you to join Jesus in His mission; share the gospel with, and make disciples among, people who are beyond the walls of the church. This process forms the basis for the content of this Joining Jesus Disciples' Journal.

The three-step process is:



PRAYERPARATION



CONNECTING WITH GOD'S PASSION

If you are going to be a disciple who joins Jesus in His mission, it is imperative that you connect with God's passion for lost people.

God is passionate about reaching the lost and if we are to join Jesus in His mission which is summarised in Luke 19:10 as follows, 'the son of man came to seek and to save the lost', we need to connect with God's heart and feel His passion for the lost people that we are among. Many lost people are close to us but far from God.

To help you to (re)discover and connect with God's heart for lost people we have produced 'Pursuing God's Heart' as a critical step in The Rooftop Process.

PURSUING GOD'S HEART

'Pursuing God's Heart' has been created to encourage and equip you, as a follower of Jesus, to discover how you can connect with the heart of God and then, see what He is doing in the community that He is inviting you to join Him in.

Pursuing The Heart of God WORKSHEETS

INTRODUCTION

Imagine gathering on a rooftop, looking across your local community and asking God to help you see it as He sees it.

Imagine receiving a fresh vision of God's heart for the lost and then, with this new vision burning in your heart, engaging with lost people who know little or nothing of Jesus - then imagine seeing them transformed.

You have imagined it ... now you can do it!

This is The Rooftop Invitation; inviting churches and Christ followers around the world ... to gather on rooftops to hear the voice of God.

- * To listen to His still small voice as He reveals His heart for their city; His heart for those who have yet to believe.
- * To listen to His still small voice as He reveals our hearts hearts that have wandered from Him ... hearts that are pursuing missions other than His ... hearts that are in the way of His using us to "turn the world upside down" for His glory (Acts 17:6).
- * To listen to the voice of God ...

And therein lies the dilemma for many of us. When was the last time you heard the voice of God? How often do you take time to be still and listen to Him speak to you? If He spoke to you today, would you recognize His voice - not audibly but with that voice in your inner man that you know beyond a doubt is God's?

We are facing a major challenge in the church today in regard to prayer. Too many of us approach prayer as a one-sided conversation with God where we do all the talking (primarily asking) and He does all the listening. But is that the biblical perspective on prayer?

I am convinced that this amazing gift of prayer that God has given us is the most misunderstood and underutilized resource in our lives today! Our desire is that when God's people gather on a rooftop to pray over their city and listen to the voice of God, they hear Him with great clarity. Our desire is when they leave that rooftop, they leave transformed for they know that they have had a fresh encounter with the living God.

The purpose behind "Pursuing the Heart of God" is simple: to give you a greater understanding of prayer, inspire you to pursue God's heart daily through prayer and prepare you for a lifetime of Rooftop Encounters with God as you Join Jesus in His Mission!

SESSION ONE: THE PURPOSE OF PRAYER

SESSION FOUR: PREPARING FOR THE ROOFTOP ENCOUNTER



DO

- . Pray into what God impressed on you as you imagined what would happen if you and your church had an encounter with God on the rooftop as Peter did. Ask God to begin revealing to all of you what attitudes of the heart are keeping you from fully joining Jesus in His mission in your city. Ask Him to meet with you as He did Peter.
- 2. Each of you read Acts 10:1–11:18 through several times prior to The Rooftop Encounter. As you read it, put yourself in the story. Imagine yourself as Cornelius, as Peter, as the Jewish believers who accompanied Peter, as those in Cornelius' home hearing the Gospel for the first time. Read it from different translations to enrich your understanding of this powerful story.
- 3. Read the following Scriptures that describe God's heart for those who are spiritually lost and far from Him. As you read the verses, ask God to transform your heart through His Word, cultivating in you His passion for people.

Matthew 9:35-38 John 3:16-17 1 Timothy 2:1-4 2 Peter 3:9

- 4. Spend time each day in your daily time alone with the Lord to pray for the upcoming Encounter. Ask God to prepare each of your hearts to see and hear clearly what He wants to reveal to you during the Encounter. Praise Him in advance for all that He will do as you seek His heart for your city.
- 5. Anticipate God. Expect God to speak. Expect God to meet with you. Expect God to do a fresh work in your life and the life of your church.




DOWNLOAD

Pray for the upcoming Rooftop Encounter. Pray for God to begin preparing your hearts to hear His voice clearly and see what He sees during the Encounter. Pray that this Encounter would be the catalyst God would use to move your church beyond the walls of your buildings and lives to engage others and make disciples.

Now that you have spent time in (re)connecting with God's heart for the lost, it is time for you to participate in a unique 'Moment' where you will have an encounter with God and earnestly seek a fresh vision of His heart for the lost.

We call this 'Moment' a Rooftop Encounter.

MOMENT



Seeking A Fresh Vision of God's Heart for the Lost

The purpose of this time together is to seek a fresh vision of God's heart for the lost.

Allow time and space for listening both to God and to one another. Periods of silence may be a very good thing as you open your heart and mind to God's presence among you and seek His heart.

THE ENCOUNTER

This Encounter with God may take place in a variety of different ways. You may be part of an online video conference, on a rooftop or hilltop, or on a building with others from the local church that you belong to. Alternatively, you may be gathered together, online or in-person, with Christians from many other local expressions of the church across your village, town or city.

Below is a suggested outline for your Encounter:

- 1. Begin your time together on the rooftop by asking God to meet with and guide you as you gather (10 minutes)
- 2. As a group, read aloud the story of Peter and Cornelius that is included on the next pages (10 minutes)

Acts 10:1-11:18 (NIV)

At Caesarea there was a man named Cornelius, a centurion in what was known as the Italian Regiment. He and all his family were devout and God-fearing; he gave generously to those in need and prayed to God regularly. One day at about three in the afternoon he had a vision. He distinctly saw an angel of God, who came to him and said, "Cornelius!"

Cornelius stared at him in fear. "What is it, Lord?" he asked.

The angel answered, "Your prayers and gifts to the poor have come up as a memorial offering before God. Now send men to Joppa to bring back a man named Simon who is called Peter. He is staying with Simon the tanner, whose house is by the sea."

When the angel who spoke to him had gone, Cornelius called two of his servants and a devout soldier who was one of his attendants. He told them everything that had happened and sent them to Joppa.

Peter's Vision

About noon the following day as they were on their journey and approaching the city, Peter went up on the roof to pray. He became hungry and wanted something to eat, and while the meal was being prepared, he fell into a trance. He saw heaven opened and something like a large sheet being let down to earth by its four corners. It contained all kinds of four-footed animals, as well as reptiles of the earth and birds of the air. Then a voice told him, "Get up, Peter. Kill and eat."

"Surely not, Lord!" Peter replied. "I have never eaten anything impure or unclean."

The voice spoke to him a second time, "Do not call anything impure that God has made clean." This happened three times, and immediately the sheet was taken back to heaven.

While Peter was wondering about the meaning of the vision, the men sent by Cornelius found out where Simon's house

was and stopped at the gate. They called out, asking if Simon who was known as Peter was staying there.

While Peter was still thinking about the vision, the Spirit said to him, "Simon, three men are looking for you. So get up and go downstairs. Do not hesitate to go with them, for I have sent them."

Peter went down and said to the men, "I'm the one you're looking for. Why have you come?"

The men replied, "We have come from Cornelius the centurion. He is a righteous and God-fearing man, who is respected by all the Jewish people. A holy angel told him to ask you to come to his house so that he could hear what you have to say." Then Peter invited the men into the house to be his guests.

Peter at Cornelius's House

The next day Peter started out with them, and some of the believers from Joppa went along. The following day he arrived in Caesarea. Cornelius was expecting them and had called together his relatives and close friends. As Peter entered the house, Cornelius met him and fell at his feet in reverence. But Peter made him get up. "Stand up," he said, "I am only a man myself."

While talking with him, Peter went inside and found a large gathering of people. He said to them: "You are well aware that it is against our law for a Jew to associate with or visit a Gentile. But God has shown me that I should not call anyone impure or unclean. So when I was sent for, I came without raising any objection. May I ask why you sent for me?"

Cornelius answered: "Three days ago I was in my house praying at this hour, at three in the afternoon. Suddenly a man in shining clothes stood before me and said, 'Cornelius, God has heard your prayer and remembered your gifts to the poor. Send to Joppa for Simon who is called Peter. He is a guest in the home of Simon the tanner, who lives by the sea.' So I sent for you immediately, and it was good

of you to come. Now we are all here in the presence of God to listen to everything the Lord has commanded you to tell us."

Then Peter began to speak: "I now realize how true it is that God does not show favouritism but accepts from every nation the one who fears him and does what is right. You know the message God sent to the people of Israel, announcing the good news of peace through Jesus Christ, who is Lord of all. You know what has happened throughout the province of Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John preached—how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and power, and how he went around doing good and healing all who were under the power of the devil, because God was with him.

"We are witnesses of everything he did in the country of the Jews and in Jerusalem. They killed him by hanging him on a cross, but God raised him from the dead on the third day and caused him to be seen. He was not seen by all the people, but by witnesses whom God had already chosen—by us who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. He commanded us

to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one whom God appointed as judge of the living and the dead. All the prophets testify about him that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name."

While Peter was still speaking these words, the Holy Spirit came on all who heard the message. The circumcised believers who had come with Peter were astonished that the gift of the Holy Spirit had been poured out even on Gentiles. For they heard them speaking in tongues[b] and praising God.

Then Peter said, "Surely no one can stand in the way of their being baptized with water. They have received the Holy Spirit just as we have." So he ordered that they be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ. Then they asked Peter to stay with them for a few days.

Peter Explains His Actions

The apostles and the believers throughout Judea heard that the Gentiles also had received the word of God. So when Peter went up to Jerusalem, the circumcised believers criticized him and said, "You went into the house of uncircumcised men and ate with them."

Starting from the beginning, Peter told them the whole story: "I was in the city of Joppa praying, and in a trance I saw a vision. I saw something like a large sheet being let down from heaven by its four corners, and it came down to where I was. I looked into it and saw four-footed animals of the earth, wild beasts, reptiles and birds. Then I heard a voice telling me, 'Get up, Peter. Kill and eat.' "I replied, 'Surely not, Lord! Nothing impure or unclean has ever entered my mouth.'

"The voice spoke from heaven a second time, 'Do not call anything impure that God has made clean.' This happened three times, and then it was all pulled up to heaven again.

"Right then three men who had been sent to me from Caesarea stopped at the house where I was staying. The Spirit told me to have no hesitation about going with them. These six brothers also went with me, and we entered the man's house. He told us how he had seen an angel appear in his house and say, 'Send to Joppa for Simon who is called Peter. He will bring you a message through which you and all your household will be saved.'

"As I began to speak, the Holy Spirit came on them as he had come on us at the beginning. Then I remembered what the Lord had said: 'John baptized with[c] water, but you will be baptized with[d] the Holy Spirit.' So if God gave them the same gift he gave us who believed in the Lord Jesus Christ, who was I to think that I could stand in God's way?"

When they heard this, they had no further objections and praised God, saying, "So then, even to Gentiles God has granted repentance that leads to life."

- 3. Having read the scripture take some time to quietly look across the city/ community (5 minutes)
- 4. Now, as a group, engage in the following questions/discussion: (30 minutes)
- What do you see as you look across the city, what kinds of people are there?
- What do you think God sees as He looks as the city?
- What do you see Jesus doing in the city?
- What are some of our attitudes and customs that may prevent us from joining Jesus in His Mission?
- What do we need to do to join Jesus in His mission to 'seek and to save what was lost'?
- 5. Following the discussion, take time to pray together as you keep your eyes open and look across the city (10 minutes)



MOVEMENT



Making disciples who make disciples beyond the walls of the church

1. ENGAGE 'GOING BEYOND THE WALLS'

You have been to the rooftop and asked God to give you a fresh vision of His heart for the lost people in your community.

For this vision to become a reality in your life, you, like Peter following his Rooftop Encounter, will need to engage with lost people beyond the walls of the church. For Peter, this meant stepping outside of all that he had ever done before and stepping into a situation where he had to trust God in a whole new way. He went to the house of a gentile! This was the beginning of a global disciple-making movement.

It is the same for us today. It is as we engage with people who are beyond the walls of the church that we will see the growth of a disciple-making movement in the 21st century.

These next four sessions have been created to help you explore and discover ways that you will engage with lost people.

As you gather in a group and consider how you will engage with lost people please:

- * Fully participate—your views and experiences are enormously important—be sure to share them
- * Be open and honest
- * Be supportive and encouraging
- * Be accountable
- * Regularly consider ways that you may join together 'as a group' to engage in local community activities that will provide you with opportunities to connect with those who are outside of the walls.

Over the past weeks you have been openly and honestly considering ways that you will engage with lost people. It may be good now to have a social time together as a group, to eat some food and talk informally about the things that each of you is learning and experiencing through this process.

This may also be a great opportunity to think/pray about opportunities that there may be for the group to do something together that will enable you, as a group, to engage with people who are beyond the walls of the church. The following questions may be helpful as you consider this:


- 1. Is there something that we enjoy doing that we could do together among people who are outside of the walls of the church? This may be a sport/activity ...
- 2. What is/are a local need(s) that we could connect with and seek to support in practical ways that will lead to the building of relationships with people who are outside of the church?
- 3. Is there something that we could do as a group that we could invite people in our community to attend? This could be very informal and provide an opportunity to build relationships

Be creative and willing to try something that is outside of your comfort zone!

2. EXPAND 'MAKING DISCIPLES'

Having considered ways that you will engage with people who are beyond the walls of the church, it is important to be clear on what is that you are seeking to 'achieve'.

If the Kingdom of God is to expand then it is vital that we 'make disciples' (Matthew 28:19) rather than 'get decisions'.

These four sessions have been created to help you explore the importance of both 'being' a disciple and 'making' disciples who will then 'be' disciples who 'make' disciples.

As you gather in a group and consider how you will engage with lost people please continue to:

- * Fully participate—your views and experiences are enormously important—be sure to share them
- * Be open and honest
- Be supportive and encouraging
- * Be accountable
- * Regularly consider ways that you may join together 'as a group' to engage in local community activities that will provide you with opportunities to connect with those who are outside of the walls

SESSION NINE: DISCIPLESHIP AND EVANGELISM

SOCIAL GATHERING - WHAT NOW?

You have spent considerable time together considering ways that you will pursue God's heart, seek a fresh vision of His passion for the lost, engage with lost people and expand the Kingdom of God in the local community.

It may be good now to have a further social time together as a group and consider next steps.

The Rooftop is not a **program** that has now been finished, it is a **process** that is intended to continue and help you to be continually 'on mission with Jesus'.

During this social gathering, eat some food and informally talk about ways that what has been happening will continue and become 'the normal' way of following Jesus.

You may find it helpful to talk/pray about some things that you could begin/continue to do together/to engage with lost people in the local community and make disciples beyond the walls of the church.

You may also want to talk/pray about how you will continue to engage with lost people and perhaps, how you will equip others to become disciples who make disciples.
